
FIRST NORTHWEST COAST COLORED TRADE BEAD CHART


A chart describing more than 50 trade beads associated with sites near the Columbia River in the state of Washington.

by Gerald B. Fenstermaker The beads in this chart were furnished by Mr. Arne Eklund, a fellow collector, whom we thank for his generosity and interest. The history of the collection was verified by two independent sources.

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The specimens in this chart are an authenticated selection of trade beads from the northwest area of the U.S. This particular area has given us some of the most fascinating examples of trade beads to be found anywhere. The variety of types of beads that occur in Northwest collections is amazing. "Russian" blue faceted, comb or feather, horned eye, polychrome, and Chinese beads are all examples of Northwest material.

An experienced collector will realize that most of the beads just mentioned are also appearing in recent shipments from Africa. The questions raised by this situation will hopefully produce more research on trade bead manufacturing and distribution. At present, caution should be exercised when adequate documentation of the source of specimens is lacking. However, this should not deter us from the fascination and enjoyment to be found with trade beads.

The first three examples are known as horned eye beads. The etchings on the Chinese bead supposedly denote "good luck". No. 7 is a "Russian" blue faceted bead.

No. 5 is a comb or feather bead. No. 6 is an interesting shape similar in material to row 1, No. 5.

No. 3 is a roller bead similar in material to row 4, No. 7. No. 6 is a large Chinese melon bead.

The vaseline bead is rather unusual.

Nos. 2 thru 5 are known as "chicken eggs" among some collectors.
